## St. Leonard and St. Rita Communities - Frequently Asked Questions

Why does St. Leonard need to be hosted at another location?

On May9, St. Leonard Catholic Elementary School suffered extensive damage as a result of several fires that were set within the building. The Health and Safety Department, in conjunction with the Plant Department is working with the Ontario School Board Insurance Exchange (OSBIE) to determine the extent of the damage. Until such time as further information is available from OSBIE and for staff to recommend a permanent plan of action, students from St. Leonard will require hosting at an alternate location.

Why was St. Rita selected to host St. Leonastudents?

Variousoptions were explored in developing a contingency plan to host St. Le**stade**nts. St. Rita was the most viable since it has sufficient capacity available in the building and the six portables on site to accommodate both schools. Infrastructure is in place to operate separate telephone lines, PA system and school bells. St. Rita is in close proximity to the St. Leonard school community which will provide for a shorter bus ride for students. St. Rita and St. Leonard are both within the St. Leonard Parish boundary.

Will St. Leonardstudents be in combined classes with St. Rita students?

No. Both schools will operate with their own classes and teachers. There will be limited interaction between students at the two schools

Will St. Leonard the host period.

What about start/end times?

Startand end time for St. Rita and St. Leonard with ain the same. St. Rita will start at 9:15 am and end at 3:45 pm. St. Leonard with at 8:30 am and end at 3:00 pm.

What about recess and the use of the gymnasiam library?

Due to the earlier start and end times for St. Leonardevents will be offset from those of St. Rita. This includes access to the gymnasium, library and outdoor play space.
